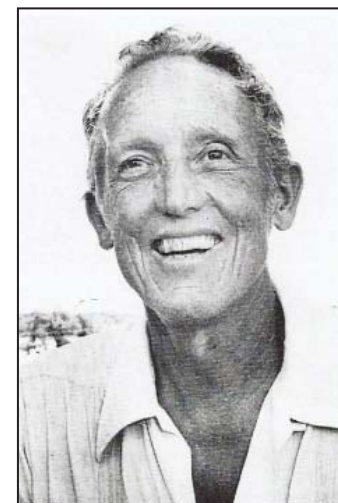

Jump on the Blob, have fun, the end

These are the wise words of my 9-year-old daughter. When I was asked to write this article for LUMNEWS, my daughter, BROOKLYN, asked me what I was going to write about. I told her I wasn't sure. She said ohhh, I know, "Jump on the Blob. Have fun. The End." Somehow, that wasn't the end. I hope this family camp legacy will go on for years to come.

My camp history started back in 1955 on Inks Lake. My mother, TERRIE HAMBLÉN BURSIEL and her cousin JOHANNA SMITH, went to camp for the first time. In those days camp was 4 weeks of water sports, horses and frisbees (no Blob, yet). One of her favorite memories included being greeted by BILL and MF JOHNSON as she arrived at camp and being wrapped in their arms as they lovingly welcomed each camper back, or welcomed them to camp for the first time.

Fast forward to 30 years, when my sister first attended Camp Longhorn as a Pony. Four years later in 1989 on the 50th anniversary of Indian Springs, I attended my first year as a Rattlesnake. My first year at camp was a first of many for me as a camper. It was the first time to spend that amount of time away from my parents, it was the first time to swim a mile, getting Campfire lighter on the first day, and being the first to "break in" the Ranger program.

As a first-year Rattlesnake, one the first, and most comforting, things I remember is NAN MANNING meeting me and giving me one of the biggest hugs, and welcoming me to camp. That was when I knew I was a member of the Camp Longhorn family. Laying in my bunk at quiet time, eating chow, or simply jumping on the Blob, I never dreamed that 28 years later, I would be getting my daughter ready for her second year at Camp Longhorn.

In my 9 years as a camper, there are so many wonderful memories. From friends to inspections, to quiet time, to wonderful counselors, to endless activities, to the blob. All of this started in the chow hall on visitor's day in 1988, when SALLY gave me my camp interview. Then to see my daughter having her camp interview sitting almost in the same spot in the chow hall, overlooking Indian Spings brought back so many memories.

On the car ride home from her camp visit and interview, all she could talk about was going to camp and how much fun it would be. That evening after

dinner, she pulled out my camp annuals, and started flipping through them. I asked her what she was doing and she simply responded, "I'm looking at all the fun you had at camp."

Now, she looks at my annuals to see who is still there compared to hers and she looks at hers to remember how much fun she had her first year. She can't wait to go back!!

In this small world, you never know whose path you are going to cross, a few years after starting camp, my family moved to Wimberley, Texas. Soon we crossed paths with BILL and MF. Twenty-three years later, even though BILL is no longer with us, MF is still a shining face that occasionally steps through my office door to catch up on the local Wimberley politics, and share stories from our time at camp, as she has done for 17 years.

We never know where the paths we take will lead us. I am so glad for the path my mother's parents took in sending her to camp in 1955. I am happy that my parents went down that same path to send me to Camp Longhorn. It's amazing to me, to go back and see camp today. To see so many familiar faces from the past, that are still there today.

When mom goes to V-Day she still sees so many familiar faces from her time at camp. Camp Longhorn is truly a family, in every sense of the word. I love sitting down with my daughter and hearing the stories she tells of camp. The story of her favorite activity, Blob of course, whose wasn't? We even talk about our least favorite activity. Mine was Pickleball. She loved it. I can see why as somehow there were marshmallows involved. Spending this time with her talking about her memories of her first year at camp, gives me the same time to think back over my years there and to relive my memories. Over the years many things have changed, but more importantly many more things have stayed the same.

Even though the times have changed, activities have changed, the memories and the

stories have all stayed the same. We will never forget the caring faces of our camp directors, or the nightly campfire skits, church mountain and even the apple crisp at chow. The memories made at camp will last a lifetime, as will the legacy of Camp Longhorn.

So, in the words of my daughter, BROOKLYN, "Jump on the Blob. Have Fun. The End."

Thanks, MARK BURSIEL, for such an interesting writing! And, thank you TERRIE HAMBLÉN BURSIEL and JOHANNA SMITH for your camping days and encouraging MARK to attend. Very little has changed. A visit between TERRIE and your daughter BROOKLYN is probably about the same as a visit between you and your daughter. And, what a great focus point . . . The BLOB! MARK was a camper for 9 years at Indian Springs. His early years were in Conroe, TX with the family moving to Wimberley a few years after he started camp. MARK, a Real Estate Agent for Century 21 and wife KAREE a teacher, have two children BROOKLYN (9) and 2017 will be her 2nd year at Indian Springs and HUNTER (5), a future Rattlesnake at Indian Springs. MARK was a top 5 mile swimmer · twice, a big Stockholder and a Campfire Lighter twice. Life lessons learned at Camp LH

I can remember coming home in the fall of 3rd grade and telling my parents that I had to go to Camp Longhorn the next summer. Having returned back to school, my best friend, LAUREN CARRIGAN, had quickly sold me on the adventures of her summer on INKS LAKE. My parents were convinced after meeting BILLY ROB at Carnival and before I knew it, I was packing my blue wooden trunk for 2nd TERM of 1991.

We met the camp buses in Houston's Memorial City Mall parking lot and while my parents were becoming emotional, I couldn't wait for my adventure to begin.

I remember instantly feeling like a Longhorn girl as I stepped off the bus and they announced I was a Canary. I'll never forget the special friends and counselors who took me under their wing ... and whom I wanted to be just like MEG JONES and GREER TERRY who always had a smile on their faces. LYLE FOSTER- so fun and funny. SARAH BROWN and LINDSAY GREEN, who were older and introduced me to their friends, thank you. CHRISTINE MOORE, who welcomed me as her camper my first year and now our children attend the same school in Austin.

Camp was magical, like a vacation from real life. Thinking back on this time, I realize that over a few short weeks, camp traditions and life lessons were subconsciously ingrained in our minds to help us through our adulthood.

Five things I learned at Camp Longhorn include:

1. Seize the Day- Camp was like one three-week long play date. We were kept active and entertained. in a causal authentic way. It was amazing we could complete ten activities, three meals and still have time for tether ball and Camp Fire. No empty hours to complain of boredom or to stare at the television. Activity! Each day beginning with announcements on the loud speaker and closing peacefully singing taps. It's a wonder I never joined the military because to this day, I still crave a schedule.

2. Resiliency- The kind of encouragement and nurture we received at camp made it a great environment to endure setbacks, try new things, and see that improvement comes when you give something another try. Sailing, Blabbing, Archery, Marina Mud, The Mile Swim, Skit Night, dancing with boys at Dance Night... trying new things at camp was exciting and made me feel like it was safe to step out of

my comfort zone. I think having successful experiences away from home helped me become more resilient while building my confidence and identity.

3. Be happy ... and be happy for others -I've always thought being happy is a choice. It became contagious, seeing the directors and counselors at camp always encouraging campers with positive and outgoing attitudes. What's Cookin'?

Here are some exciting recipes from a very special person . . She is our yearbook editor at Inks Lake! We thank you, ANGELA MOORE, for these delicious sounding recipes!

SLOW-COOKER CHOCOLATE CANDY

2 pounds salted dry-roasted peanuts
4 ounces German sweet chocolate (about 4 squares)
One 12-ounce package semisweet chocolate chips (about 2 cups)
2 1/2 pounds white almond bark

Put the peanuts in the bottom of a 4-quart slow cooker. Layer the chocolate over the peanuts, beginning with the sweet chocolate, followed by the chocolate chips and then the almond bark. Set the temperature on low and cook for 3 hours . Do not stir the mixture. After 3 hours, stir the mixture with a wooden spoon until smooth. Drop the candy into cupcake pan liners using about 2 tablespoons per liner.

Allow the candy to cook completely before removing the cupcake liners.

CORN CASSEROLE

1 (15 1/4-ounce) can whole kernel corn, drained
1 (14 3/4-ounce) can cream-style corn
1 (8-ounce) package corn muffin mix (recommended: Jiffy)
1 cup sour cream
1/2 stick butter, melted
1 to 1 1/2 cups shredded Cheddar

In a large bowl, stir together the 2 cans of corn, corn muffin mix, sour cream, and melted butter . Pour into a greased 9 x 13-inch casserole dish. Bake for 45 minutes, or until golden brown. Remove from oven and top with cheddar . Return to oven 5 to 10 minutes, or until cheese is melted. Let stand for at least 5 minutes and then serve warm.

CROCK POT TACO CHICKEN

4 Boneless Skinless Chicken Breast
8 oz. jar Salsa
1 pkg. Taco Seasoning

Place all ingredients in the crock pot. Low for 6-7 hours or High for 3-4 hours. Shred chicken before serving.

Note: This recipe makes a lot. We usually have tacos the first night and chicken enchiladas with the leftovers.

CHOCOLATE CHIP POUND CAKE (Serves 16)

4 eggs
1 1/2 cups water
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 pkg butter recipe cake mix
One 3.4 oz pkg instant vanilla pudding mix
One 3.4 oz pkg instant chocolate pudding mix
1/2 cup (1 stick) butter
1/4 cup vegetable oil
6 ozs of chocolate chips
Confectioner's sugar for dusting

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Grease and flour bundt pan. In a mixing bowl, beat the eggs, water, and vanilla by hand. Stir in the cake mix and the pudding mixes. Slowly add the butter and oil, and mix well. Stir in the chocolate chips. Pour into the prepared pan.

Bake for 50-60 minutes. Cool for 10 minutes, then invert onto a cake plate.

Sift confectioner's sugar over the cake, or drizzle chocolate sauce over cake . . if desired.

counting the great times we had.

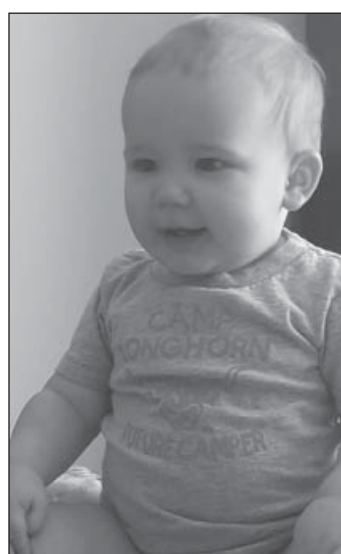

Here's my advice to the parents of the new Legacies

This past summer during third term, my wife, SHANNON ELLIOTT HARVEY, and I were out at dinner with Camp friends JEREMY WILHELMI and BETH McBRIDE WILHELMI since our two kids and their three kids were at Camp. During dinner, SHANNON's phone rang. Since the caller ID indicated the call was from Burnet, SHANNON answered in case there was an emergency. Fortunately, it was not the Pit Stop, but rather it was HELEN. HELEN first confirmed that SHANNON had already written an article for the LUMNews, and then she asked me if I would be willing to write an article. I am not sure if anyone has ever refused HELEN, but I certainly did not plan on being the first.

As I pondered what to write for my article, I considered writing about the relationships forged at Camp, Camp experiences that remain applicable to everyday life, or how we can strive to meet Camp ideals to improve everyday life. These are all excellent themes that have received outstanding treatment in these very pages, but I wanted to write something a little different.

Now, I spent 15 summers at Ranch Branch/Ranch Camp Longhorn/Camp Longhorn - Indian Springs which puts me squarely in second place at my house behind SHANNON's 17 summers (though I do like to point out that my 26 terms eclipse her total number of terms), and so we often run into other CLH alums, and, judging by carnivals, V-Days, and bus drop-offs, it seems like all of them are sending new legacies to Camp every year.

As a long time camper and counselor, someone who is married to an even longer time camper and counselor, and a parent to a son who started as a Rattlesnake and daughter who started as a Pony, I think I am qualified to offer some advice to those former campers and counselors who are about to send their kids off to Camp.

1. Your kids are in good hands, and they are going to have fun. When your first camper gets on the bus for the first time, you are going wonder what you were thinking shipping your precious child off to Burnet. Just remember how much fun you had, and how happy you were to be there, and then rush home to continually refresh the CLH Website until the Day 1 cabin pictures have been posted. After the first couple of years you will get used to it, and when all of your kids are there at the same time, you are going to think, "Wow, the house is really quiet, and what am I go-

ing to do with all of this time."

2. You are going to get far fewer letters than you think you should, and, especially if you have a boy, you might only get the letter that his counselor told him he had to write if he wanted to eat chow. Our son's first year, we did not get a letter until the end of the second week, and I had to call my mother and tell her that her grandson was paying me back for all the letters that I did not write her. Your only real option here is to pay your camper a set amount per letter received, but even that is not all that effective. You are just going to have to settle for the pictures posted on the CLH Website when it is your camper's cabin's turn to be featured on the Web site which will be every fourth of fifth day. But, look on the bright side, your parents didn't get any letters, and they did not get to see any pictures. They had to wait until V-Day to see your smiling face.

3. Once V-Day finally arrives, you might even get up very early and find yourself toward the front of a long line of cars. It is the same line of cars that used to make you wonder as a counselor, "Why would anyone get up so early just to wait in a line in a car for three hours."

4. On V-Day, let your camper lead you to show you around camp. You know, or rather knew, Camp like the back of your hand, but archery has moved three times since you last drew a bow, and, even if it is in the same place as when you were last there, there is a fancy new concrete walkway that takes you a different way to get you there. So, when your Rattlesnake starts walking to the Water Park directly from Boys' Camp instead of all the way around the Upper Lake Darn, don't tell him he is going the wrong way.

Once your camper gets back home, and as you start to talk about more Camp things with

your new campers, you will find that there are other differences from when you were at Camp and how Camp is now. You will find out that the older campers go to chow first for every meal, and the younger campers only go first on Backwards Day instead of the other way around.
